Maintaining Confidentiality: Essentially means that individuals and agencies-including early childhood professionals-may not give or receive records or other information about children or their families without written permission from the child's parents or legal guardians.

Written Permission to:

*Ask professionals, child care providers or others for information about a particular learning or behavior problem strategy to benefit the child and improve the care offered at Academic Boot Camp Troopers.

*To display progress of child's work on the wall or with others verbally.

*Share information gathered from IFSP's or IEP's with professionals (separate request form for copies or records)
